FLORIDA IS A CLOSED PRIMARY STATE

All registered voters, regardless of party affiliation, are eligible to vote for universal primary contests, nonpartisan races and on ballot questions. Only voters registered within a candidate's respective party may vote in *partisan* races.

Did you know?

There are three ways to vote

1. Vote-By-Mail

By Florida law any registered voter can vote-by-mail.

• Request to Vote-By-Mail:

A vote-by-mail ballot request may be made in person, by mail, by email, online via our website at [VoteIndianRiver.com](http://VoteIndianRiver.com), or by telephone. One request can cover a specific election or all elections through the next two General Elections.

• Wednesday, August 24, 2016

is the last day to request a vote-by-mail ballot for the Primary Election.

• Returning your completed ballot:

Include \$0.68 cents postage and return your ballot by mail, deliver your ballot in person to the Elections Office or utilize one of our NEW vote-by-mail drop boxes.

• Voted ballots must be signed and received by the Supervisor of Elections Office no later than 7:00 pm on Election Day in order to be counted.

**WHEN:** At any point there is a significant change in your signature or identifying "mark". **HOW:** Use a Florida Voter Registration Application form completing all required blocks per instructions. **WHERE:** Florida Voter Registration Application forms are available at all government offices, public assistance offices, libraries and upon request by calling or emailing our office or visiting our website.




**ALL REGISTERED VOTERS MAY VOTE FOR:**

**Universal Primary Contests:** If all candidates for an office have the same party affiliation and the winner of the Primary Election will not face opposition in the General Election, then all registered voters may vote for any of the candidates for that office in the Primary Election.

**Nonpartisan Races:** This includes judicial and school board races.
