

FLORIDA RUNS CLOSED PRIMARY ELECTIONS

In Florida primaries (unlike in municipal, general and special elections), you may vote for candidates only of the party for which you are registered. (For example, only persons registered as Democrats may vote for Democratic candidates.) There is only one exception - if all candidates running for an office have the same party affiliation, and the winner will have no opposition in the general election, then all registered voters, regardless of party affiliation, may vote on the race in the primary (Universal Primary Contest).



Did you know?

There are three ways to vote

1. Absentee Ballot

By Florida law any registered voter can vote using an absentee ballot.

- An absentee ballot request may be made in person, by mail, by e-mail, online via our website voteindianriver.com, or by telephone. One request can cover a specific election or all elections through the next two General Elections.
- Wednesday, August 20, 2014 is the last day to request an absentee ballot to be mailed to you for the Primary Election.

2. Early Voting

Early Voting is August 15th through August 23rd 7:00am - 4:00pm

Vote at your polling place! It is a felony to vote in a precinct in which you do not reside. If your address has changed, please contact the Elections Office BEFORE August 26th.






