3 EARLY VOTING LOCATIONS OFFERED FOR THE AUGUST 14TH PRIMARY ELECTION

Early voting for the Primary Election will take place from Saturday, August 4th through Saturday, August 11th. Early voting polls will be available from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. each day, at the following three locations.

Supervisor of Elections Office—4375 43rd Avenue, Vero Beach Indian River County Main Library—1600 21st Street, Vero Beach Sebastian City Hall Council Chambers—1225 Main Street, Sebastian

Supervisor of Elections, Leslie Rossway Swan, wants voters to note that Early Voting at the Sebastian location has changed from the Old Schoolhouse Building to the Sebastian City Hall Council Chambers.

Plan ahead and save time by viewing estimated early voting wait times on the Elections Office Facebook or Twitter page.

Early voters must bring identification (such as a Florida driver's license) that contains a photo and a signature. Other acceptable forms of ID can be found on the Elections Office website at www.voteindianriver.com. Voters who do not have proper identification will be required to vote a provisional ballot.

A sample ballot is now posted on the Supervisor of Elections website. Voters are encouraged to review the sample ballot and come prepared to vote – even bring along the sample ballot with your predetermined choices marked to expedite the process.

Voters also have the option of requesting an absentee ballot to be mailed to them. Absentee ballots cannot be forwarded, so if you will not be at your Indian River County address, please provide the address to which you want the ballot mailed. Requests for absentee ballots can be made via the website or by calling the Elections Office at 226-3440. The last day for voters to request an absentee ballot to be mailed to them is August 8, 2012 at 5:00 p.m.

Those who choose to wait until Election Day to vote must go to their assigned polling location. Precinct numbers have changed, and all voters were mailed a new voter information card indicating their new precinct number and polling location. Voters may confirm their polling location by visiting the Supervisor of Elections website and clicking the "Find Your Precinct" tab, or by calling the Elections Office.
