COUNTY'S VOTER ROLLS HIT 100K

Indian River County, FL – Supervisor of Elections Leslie Swan announced that Indian River County's registration rolls have officially reached 100,000 voters as of Wednesday, October 8, 2015. "This is a huge milestone in the county's history considering that just 15 years ago a mere 71,420 Indian River County residents were registered to vote," said Supervisor Swan.

Of the 100,000 voters, just over 45 percent are registered as Republicans, while the rest are split evenly between Democrats and Others, which includes no party and minor affiliation voters. A 2014 estimate from the US Census Bureau placed the county's population at 144,755, with a voting age population of 119,423, meaning that about 82% of Indian River County voting age population is registered to vote. The states average is only 75 percent.

Four out of every five voting age residents are registered, which indicates that Indian River County is civic-minded and vested in the well-being of our county and nation. Despite our high registration rate, voter turnout could use some improving. "This presidential election cycle, I challenge each one of our 100,000 voters to cast a ballot, whether absentee, early or on Election Day," stated Swan.
