### WHERE DO I VOTE?

On Election Day you must vote at your polling place. Locate your polling place online at VoteIndianRiver.com or call 772.226.3440.

It is a felony to vote in a precinct in which you do not reside.

If your address has changed, please contact the Elections Office BEFORE August 28th.

#### ID Requirement

Section 101.043, F.S., requires voters to provide a valid photo and signature identification to vote. If you do not have valid identification, you may vote a provisional ballot.

#### Forms of Acceptable ID Include:

Florida Driver's License Florida ID Card U.S. Passport Military or Student ID Debit/Credit Card Government Issued Employee ID Concealed Weapons Permit Veterans Affairs ID Public Assistance ID Retirement or Neighborhood Association ID







# **YOUR PARTY AFFILIATION**

FLORIDA IS A CLOSED PRIMARY STATE (F.S. 101.021)

Only voters who are registered members of political parties may vote for their respective party's candidates in a primary election.

#### ALL REGISTERED VOTERS MAY VOTE FOR:

Nonpartisan Races: This includes judicial and school board races.

Constitutional Amendments and/or Local Referendum Questions

**Universal Primary Contests:** If all candidates for an office have the same party affiliation and the winner of the Primary Election will not face opposition in the General Election, then all registered voters may vote for any of the candidates for that office in the Primary Election.
